#### Histrical Parade



#### Ema of "Namode-odori Dance"

Three precious Edo-period votive plaques, depicting rain-making rituals and their fulfillment, will be specially exhibited at Kojima-jinja Shrine.





#### The Stone Walls Bathed in **Autumn Colors**

Takatori-jo Castle Ruins, one of Japan's Three Great Mountain Castles, is also famous as a light hiking course. Along the ascent, you'll encounter the mysterious Saruishi (Monkey Stone), a rare water moat typical of mountain castles, the Kunimi Yagura ruins with splendid views, and stone walls that increase in number as you approach the summit.

In autumn, you can admire the vibrantly colored maple trees around the stone walls of the main keep's ruins. Let's enjoy hiking to the summit while feeling the autumn atmosphere.

**XVisitors** should wear comfortable walking attire and be mindful about the descent time.

Statues of Lord Toyotomi Hidenaga and Lord Honda Toshimasa.


